The first steps

National standards

- ÖNORM A 700 Facility Management Grundkonzepte (2000-12)
- NEN 2748 Cost categories related to facilities management
- BSI, DIN, etc

NEN 2748 was submitted in 2000 to be a base for a new CEN standard

- Voted down by CEN members
- NEN = New FM standards should be elaborated
- CEN/BT/WG 136 "Facility management

Definition of FM

CEN 2006

Integration of processes within an organisation to maintain and develop the agreed services which support and improve the effectiveness of its primary activities

ISO 2017

Organizational function which integrates people, place and process (3.5.1) within the built environment (3.2.3) with the purpose of improving the quality (3.7.1) of life of people and the productivity of the core business (3.1.7)
